All grade nine students are enrolled in: English Language Arts, Social Studies, Science, Math, Numeracy, Literacy, Phys Ed, Religion, and Health.

Grade 9 - Elective Descriptions

CTF Art 9 - Students use a range of tools, materials and media to express how they feel, to think artistically and value art. They draw and create art, and examine the art that others have made. * Fees apply*



CTF Ceramics 9 - Learn the art of creating with clay. *Fees apply*

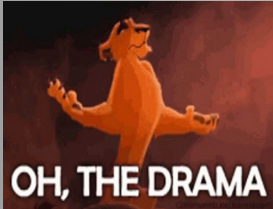


CTF Computers 9 - Learn the basics in computer operations and programs including coding, game design and graphics.

Grade 9 - Elective Descriptions Continued



CTF Construction 9 - Students will use basic hand tools, power tools, and production skills to safely transform common building materials into useful products. They will utilize basic construction and woodworking techniques to produce three wood projects. Students will have the option to use V-Carve software to create projects with a CNC Router. *Fees apply*



CTF Drama 9 - This course introduces and explores theatre from page to stage as a live performing art. Topics include: exploring improv, script writing, character development, stage makeup and more, all while developing communication and collaboration skills.



CTF ESports 9 - Fundamentals provides students a digital framework through an e-sports lens. Students will explore the history of esports, learn genres of games, practice good gamer health, teamwork, and learn basic technology and hands on troubleshooting. *Fees apply*

Grade 9 - Elective Descriptions Continued



CTF Film Studies 9 - Love movies? Love talking about movies? Want to know what makes your favorite movies so great? Students will learn the techniques used to create films, what makes a story so popular in today's culture, and how these films will continue to influence the film industry and society for years to come.



CTF Foods 9 - Students learn basic culinary and baking techniques in a variety of labs, ensuring safety. The goal of the course is to enhance knowledge and gain experience for daily life skills. *Fees apply*



CTF Forensic Science - While Science is the cornerstone of forensics, it embodies concepts in many areas including biology, chemistry, zoology, psychology, genetics, and many more. Forensic Science 9's goal is for students to make sense of complex problems that require logical reasoning and involve numerical data, evidence, and uncertainty.

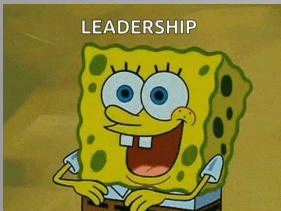
Grade 9 - Elective Descriptions Continued



CTF French 9 - Basic French as a second language for conversational learning and an introduction to French culture. No French language experience is required.



CTF Guitar 9 - Designed for students who are interested in developing their musical skills and knowledge as guitar players, songwriters, and music enthusiasts. The course is designed to spark musical interests and develop instrument playing skills. A variety of musical genres are explored. Students will leave the course with improved playing skills, a greater understanding of songwriting, and positive experiences playing in small group performances. No experience necessary! *Fees apply*



CTF Leadership 9 - This course is to provide students with the knowledge and skills necessary for effective communication, teamwork, and service to others in the school and community. It recognizes that the students must understand the concept of leadership and must be able to lead themselves before they can be effective leaders for others.

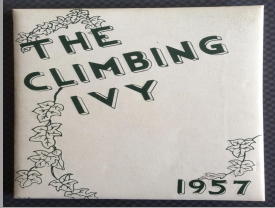


CTF Outdoor Education 9 - Students build knowledge and skills for safe outdoor experiences in all seasons, and will deepen their awareness and respect for nature. In this course, they will cover wilderness hazards and how to mitigate them, shelter building techniques, navigation skills, and a trip to the Strathcona Wilderness Centre. *Fees apply*



CTF Rec Sports 9 - Students participate and develop skills in a variety of sports and other activities that fall outside of the physical education curriculum. The goal of the course is to create meaningful and experiential learning opportunities that connect students to local area amenities and activities. Possible activities include completion of an Alberta sport fishing education course, ice fishing, archery, golf, weight and personal fitness training, hiking and walking local area paths, rock climbing, and other seasonal activities in and around Leduc. Students will learn and develop cooperation and teamwork, along with an appreciation of the benefits of maintaining an active and healthy lifestyle. *Fees apply*

CTF Yearbook 9 - Help create the school's yearbook. Take photos, design your pages and get together with other students in a fun and creative environment.



CTF Yoga Fitness 9 - This course has been designed to introduce basic postures, breathing techniques, and relaxation methods of yoga. This sequence of courses does not include the spiritual elements normally associated with Yoga. In Yoga, students experience the health benefits of the discipline of yoga and develop skills that enable them to develop well-being, balance multiple aspects of their lives, and manage priorities. *Fees apply*



STARR

Sustained & Targeted Academic Review and Research

Previously called FLEX

What: The STARR program prepares our students for high academic engagement by enriching the development of skills and acquisition of knowledge as early as possible in the school year. Students will find more success in their academic and enrichment programming by utilizing additional class time to practice and perform at more rigorous levels. They will enjoy being challenged to expand upon their knowledge and skills during flexible programming blocks that occur on a regular weekly schedule in our school.

When: Every Tuesday and Thursday from October to December and March to May.

Who: All students are required to take part in STARR. This is an attendance based block.



Student Clubs & Groups



Co-curricular activities and extra-curricular activities are an important part of life at Christ the King. In addition to clubs and teams, there are many leadership and service opportunities. The activities offered during any school year depend upon student interest and the availability of staff advisors. What follows are brief descriptions of a few of the activities and programs that will assist students in enhancing their faith, leadership skills, athleticism, and school spirit.

Student Council/Rotary Club - This club serves as a voice for the student body. Students from all grade levels are encouraged to be involved in the council. They are involved in organizing theme days and events throughout the year. In addition to this, students are encouraged to participate in activities focused on social justice and numerous community service projects.

Music Ministry - Music Ministry provides students with an opportunity to lead the school in music and song during school masses. Students are invited to share their singing and/or instrumental abilities throughout the school year. Music Ministry meets during lunch hours a few times per month.

Grade 9 Travel Club - Our grade 9 students have the opportunity to travel to Victoria for 4 days to experience the beauty and wonders of Vancouver Island. Activities include caving, harbour kayaking, ziplining, whale watching, visiting Victoria Bug Zoo and the Royal BC Museum Imax. In addition, team building activities such as escape room challenges complete this journey.

International Travel Club - At least every other year Christ the King School hosts an educational tour abroad. Past adventures have taken our students to Germany, Poland, Spain, France, Italy, Greece, and Costa Rica. The tours allow the students to discover and learn about different cultures; earning credits for Tourism through flex sessions prior to departure. Students must be in Grade 10-12.

Ski/Snowboard Club - Students have the opportunity to be part of the Ski/Snowboard Club where they will make a few trips during the school out to Rabbit Hill to enjoy the outdoor skiing and snowboarding with their peers.





CTK Charger Athletics



Christ the King has a proud tradition in interscholastic sports. Christ the King “Chargers” compete in the Edmonton Metro League in the following sports: golf, cross country running, volleyball, basketball, soccer, and badminton. Recent highlights include: Three Metro-Edmonton League Championships (Boys Volleyball, Basketball and Golf) and Edmonton Zone Championships (Girls Volleyball and Basketball; and Boys Volleyball and Golf). The Chargers also host annual volleyball and basketball tournaments. Christ the King has had numerous Edmonton Metro All-Stars in Basketball and Volleyball.

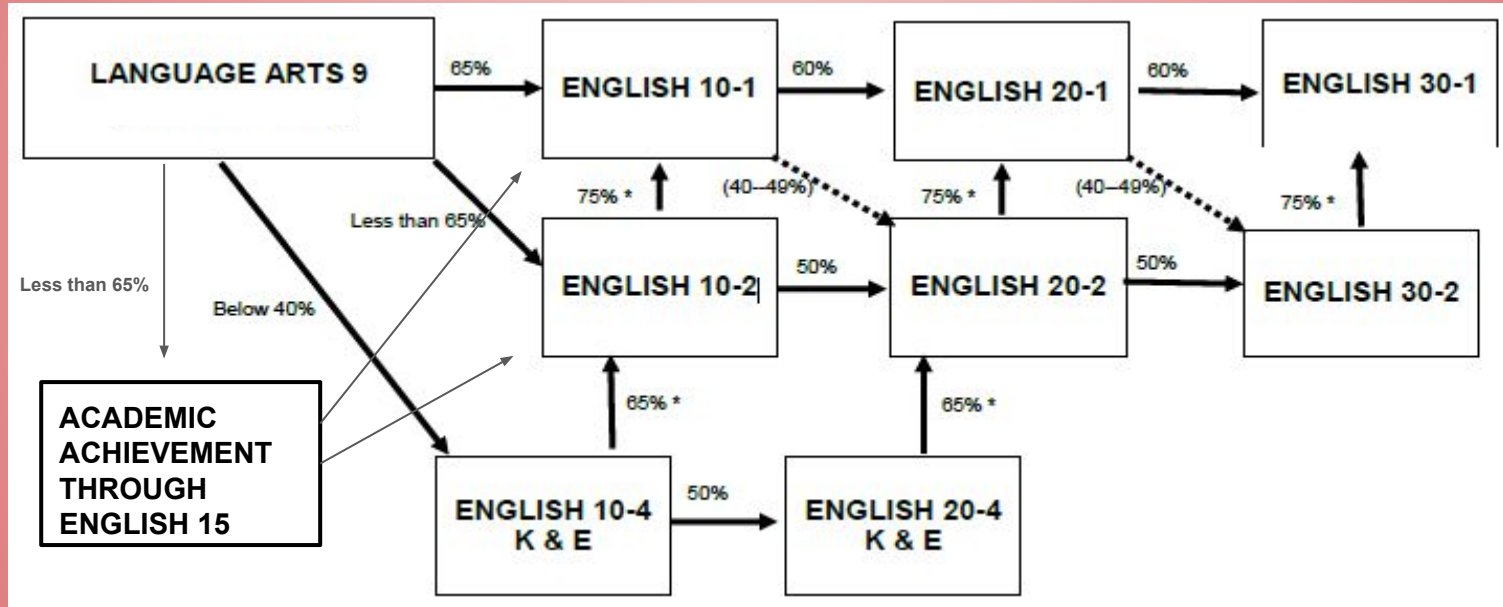

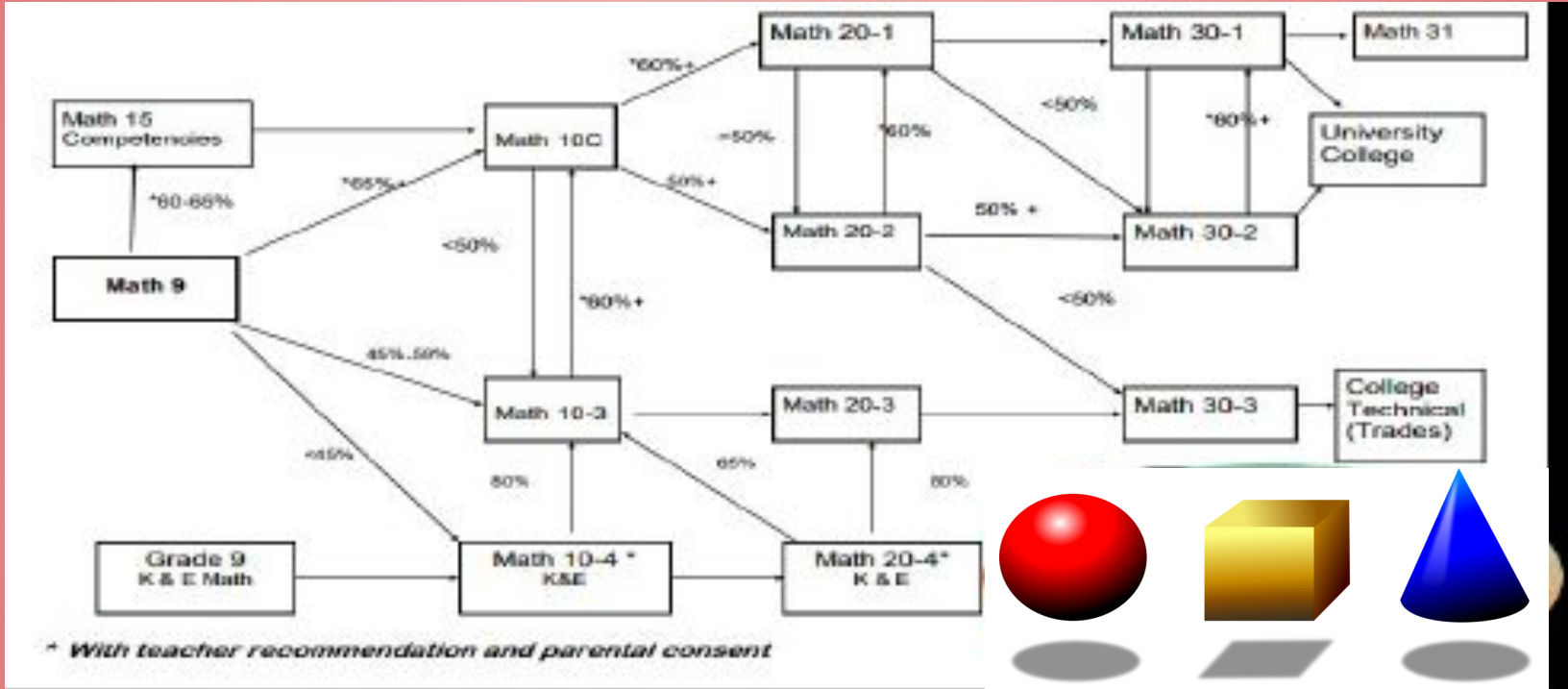

HIGH SCHOOL ENGLISH

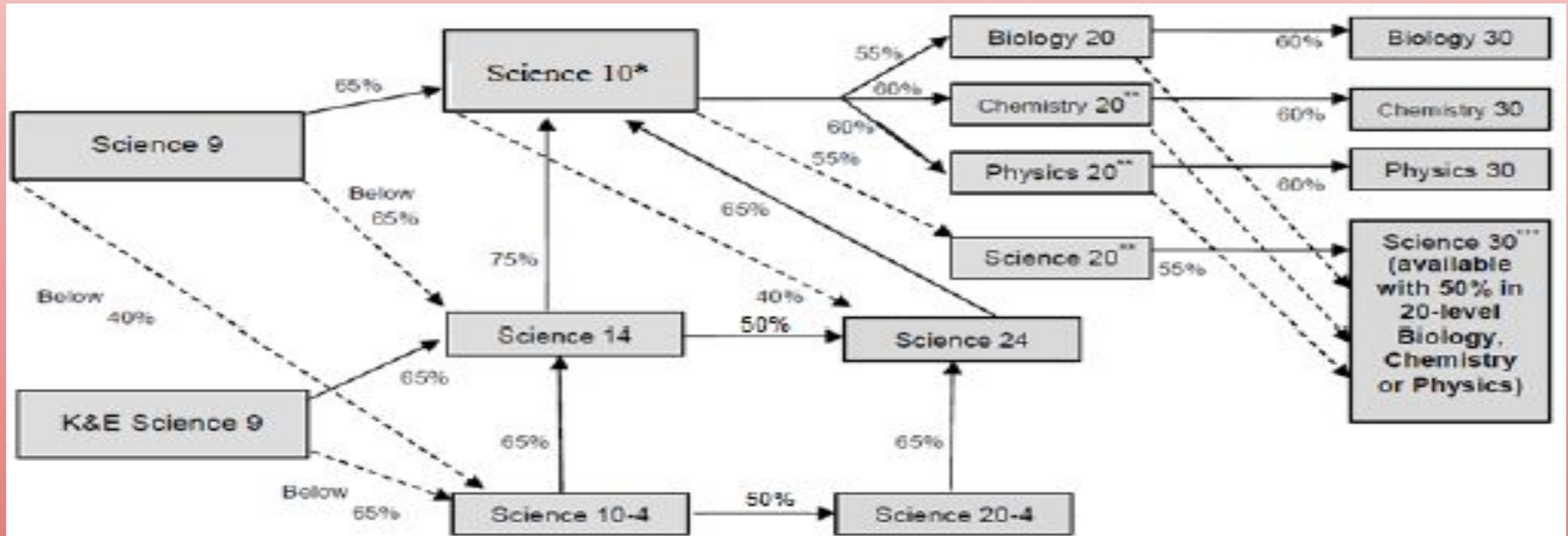


High School Math

HIGH SCHOOL SCIENCE

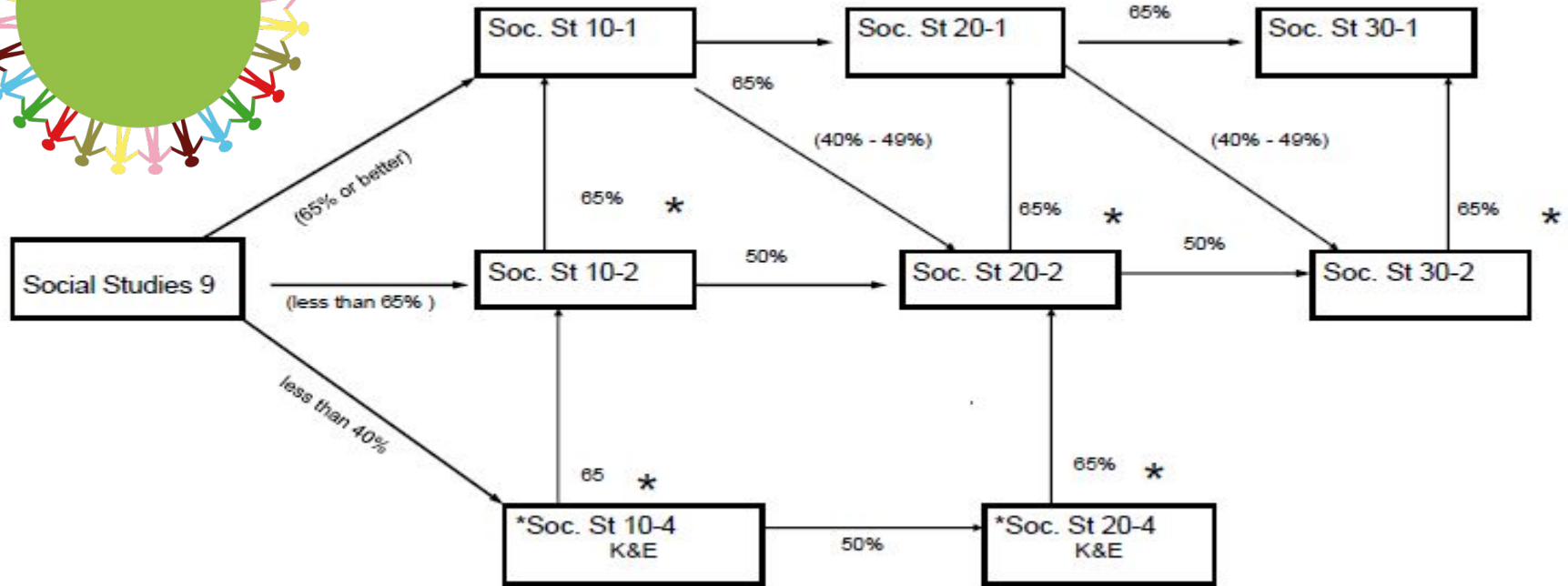


* Math 10C recommended as a co-requisite
